Grade K to 3: Sydney's Wonder Web

As spider puppet, Sydney works on her web, students learn about the parts of nature, how plants and animals depend on each other and on nonliving elements of nature for food, shelter and hiding places, and about predator-prey relationships.

Grade 4 to High School: Wetlands

Participants will study the three types of wetlands and examine the plants, animals, and soils of these

special ecosystems.

Students also learn about the benefits of wetlands and why they are valuable to humans ecologically, aesthetically and economically.

History and Culture of Life on the Frontier

Students will learn about the life of an 18th-century frontier family. From house chores, Colonial fashions, and how families were organized (and the differences between Men, Women and Enslaved People), to learning about food from garden to table, students will discover the important life skills that were a part of everyday survival and success.

Learning activities include a flintlock weapons demonstration and a demonstration of fire-starting with flint and steel. Students get an overview of the cabin's history and use—what kind of people lived there, what was happening at the time—plus
